Urgent Care

For minor or non-life-threatening conditions, including:

- Cold or flu
- Fever, cough or sore throat
- Mild headache or migraine
- Minor ear/eye infections
- Minor allergic reactions, asthma attacks or rashes
- Vomiting and diarrhea (gastroenteritis)
- Urinary tract infections (painful urination)

- Minor cuts or wounds requiring stitches
- Minor burns
- Minor orthopedic injuries, sprains and strains
- Insect bites
- Toothache
